CSM Brisentine enlisted in the U.S. Army Reserve in January 1989 as a wheeled vehicle operator at the St. Louis Military Entrance Processing Station. He attended Basic Training and Advanced Individual Training at Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri. CSM Brisentine served five years in the AR before transitioning to active service in February 1994. He has served in every enlisted leadership position ranging from squad leader to first sergeant in the 82nd Airborne Division, Fort Bragg, North Carolina. CSM Brisentine has been an AIT instructor at the FLW Engineer School and senior instructor at the Fort Bragg Primary Leadership Development Course at Fort Bragg. Over the course of his career, he has served in the following key leadership billets: truckmaster, operations NCO, and land movement operations NCO in NATO.
